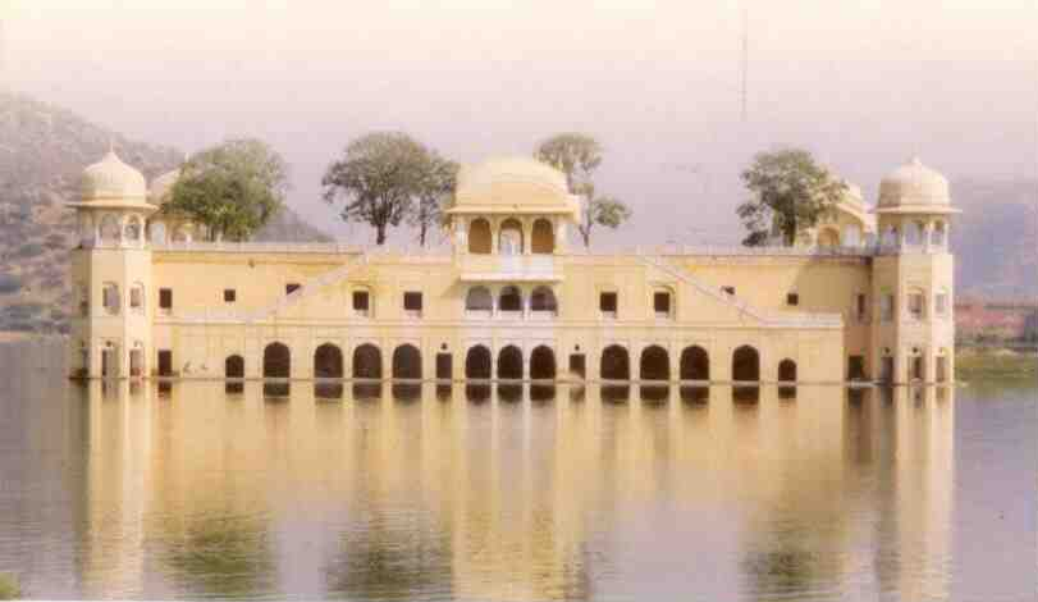

INTRODUCTION

Rajasthan being the largest state is spread over an area of 3.42 lacs sq km, which is 10.43 percent of the total land area of the country. Around 79% of the human population in Rajasthan resides in villages. The average size of their land holding has shrunk considerably. As such, livestock operations have expressed their superiority over crop farming in terms of growth, stability, resource conservation and upliftment of the socio-economic status of the inhabitants. Development of livestock sector is therefore the critical pathway to rural prosperity.

The state is endowed with prized milch and draught cattle breeds viz. Rathi, Tharparkar, Gir, Kankrej and Nagouri. Murrah and Surti are the main buffalo breeds being reared in the state.

To promote breeding & development of economically important livestock wealth and to introduce, promote and adopt appropriate technology for improving all aspects of livestock production and their productivity, Rajasthan Livestock Development Board has been setup by the State Government. RLDB has accordingly been designated as the "State Implementing Agency" for implementing NPCBB in the state of Rajasthan.

Tourist places of Jaipur



Jantar Mantar : Jantar Mantar is the largest and best preserved of Sawai Jai Singh's five observatories. It is built in stone and marble whose setting and shapes are designed scientifically and which are one of the highpoints of medieval Indian astronomy.

Jaigarh Fort : The western skyline is dominated by the extensive parkotas (walls), watch towers and gateways of Jaigarh. It is one of the few military structures of medieval India preserved almost intact containing palaces, a granary, an armory, a well planned cannon foundry, a tall tower & a giant mounted cannon-the Jai Ban one of the biggest in the world.



City Palace : In the heart of the old city is the former royal residence built in a blend of Rajsthani and Mughal styles. The palace houses a museum, with a superb collection of Rajsthani costumes an armory and an art gallery with an excellent collection of miniature paintings & rare astronomical works in various languages.

Hawa Mahal : The Hawa Mahal or Palace of Winds was built in 1799 A.D. This five storey building with semi-octagonal and delicately honey combed sandstone windows was originally conceived with the aim of enabling women of the royal household to watch the everyday life and royal processions of the city.



Amber Fort : Amber is the old capital of the erstwhile Jaipur state. A fascinating blend of Rajput and Mughal architecture, this complex of palaces, which emerges dramatically from the pleasant of the Maota Lake, has interesting apartments like Diwan-E-Aam, Diwan-E-Khas, Ganesh Pole, Sheesh Mahal, Sukh Niwas, Jas Mandir, Man Singh Palace & Shila Devi Temple.

Museum (Albert Hall) : Central Museum is situated in Ram Niwas Garden. The foundation of this graceful building was laid in 1876 AD by Prince Albert. The museum contains a large collection of archeological, an excellent collection of miniature paintings, a mummy of EGYPT, a variety of collection of costumes of Rajsthani culture and handicraft pieces.



Jal Mahal : Jal Mahal of Jaipur is a pleasure palace built in the 18th century. Situated amidst the picturesque Mansagar Lake, the palace has the Nahargarh hills forming its backdrop. Jaipur Jal Mahal Palace is an architectural beauty and was meant to be used for the royal duck shooting parties.
